VOTING ABSENTEE

Absentee Voter Ballots are available to all registered voters! A registered voter may obtain an absent voter ballot if they are:

➡ Age 60 or older

- Unable to vote without assistance at the polls
- Expecting to be away from your community
- In jail awaiting arraignment or trial
- Unable to attend the polls due to religious reasons

Appointed to work as an election inspector out of your precinct.

Or ...Get an Absentee Voter Ballot Application from your City or Township Clerk. Requests to have an Absent Voter Ballot mailed to you must be received by your clerk no later than 2 p.m. the Saturday before the election and returned, SIGNED, by 8 p.m. on election day. Your Absentee Ballot envelope has to be SIGNED to be counted!

Senior Millage VOTE Information



According to the U.S. Census, Leelanau County's overall population these past eight years has held constant with very little change. However, the senior population has steadily increased and currently makes up 40% of the population (approx. 8,724). Based on the current trends of senior growth it is quite possible within the next three years that over 50% of the population eligible to vote in Leelanau County will be 60 years of age and older.

Leelanau County Senior Services has prided itself on being ready to serve all seniors offering support and resources to allow them to remain in their homes and living life on their terms. This past year LCSS's newsletter reached 5,500 senior households per publication, and our services touched 29% of the senior population, approximately 2,500 seniors.

LCSS provides a broad spectrum of services and plays a pivotal role in connecting people with community organizations and services available to assist seniors in maintaining their independence. It has also been our honor to provide inhome services (personal care, respite care, medication management, and homemaking) and some financial assistance to seniors with a limited income falling under poverty guidelines.

As the senior population continues to rise in Leelanau County, Senior Services has seen an

increase in the number of seniors seeking information, services and support through our office. Senior Services is looking to the future to strengthen and extend our reach to all seniors to promote aging well in Leelanau County.

BREAKING

The Senior Service Millage will be on the August 7th Primary ballot with an increased millage rate of .320 for two years. The millage rate of .320 will equate to \$32.00 of tax for every \$100,000 in property taxable value per year. This would be an increase of \$4.50 per year from the current millage rate of .275.

The increase, if approved, will allow the Senior Services to:

Enhance current services and supports for all seniors in their homes.

Maintain in home services supported by Senior Services as well as offer home visits to assist seniors in making a plan for aging in place by connecting with them services provided by Senior Services or other agencies and service providers in the area including volunteers.

Create additional educational opportunities related to aging and caregiving.

- Collaborate with individuals and organizations to offer classes and trainings related to specific health concerns as well as information to help prepare seniors for the future.
- Increase activities to engage in healthy aging.
 - Coordinate volunteer opportunities for seniors to assist other seniors.
 - Expand senior transportation programs in Leelanau County.
